

St Andrew's United Reformed Church is in the Montpellier district of Cheltenham town centre. A former Presbyterian church founded in 1885, it became United Reformed on unification in 1972. Recent renovations now offer an impressive facility, meeting the needs of 21st century Cheltenham.

Prestbury United Reformed Church is in the heart of Prestbury village on the northern edge of Cheltenham. A former Congregational chapel built in 1866, becoming United Reformed on unification in 1972.

The Church in Warden Hill is a Local Ecumenical Partnership (LEP) between the Anglican (St Christopher's) and URC communities of Hatherley and Warden Hill in the south of Cheltenham. Ministry is shared between the URC Minister, Revd Maz Allen, and members of the Anglican South Cheltenham Team Ministry. Both the Anglican and URC buildings are regularly used for worship.

Our Minister Writes:



Dear Friends,

This month sees the closure of C4 Children's Choir, after nine years and more than twenty musicals. It was one of the first things I started when I arrived in Cheltenham in 2007. C4 stands for 'Cheltenham Churches Children's Choir' and included 5-10 year olds from all three URC's. Over the years, the vast majority of children came from St. Mary's Infant and Junior Schools in Prestbury, with the cast developing from 5 year olds who could hardly read to 10 year olds who took lead roles. Acting has never been a passion of mine, but the children wanted to do more than sing right from the start. So we attempted some ambitious scripts, the hardest being 'The Wind in the Willows'. Great fun has been had every Friday evening for an hour, even though I have been known to shout occasionally! Over the past two terms, a new school choir has started in the Junior School and I have lost most of my older children, leaving the 5-7 year olds to hold the fort. It is probably time to call it a day, sad though that is.

So, as you will read in this magazine, there will be a special performance of 'The Peace Child' just for the churches, on Saturday 23rd April, 3pm at Prestbury URC. I wanted to give you a chance to see these wonderful youngsters for the last time and also to thank you for all your support over the nine years. You will need a ticket (which is free) from me or Fiona Hall. Please come and applaud the hard work of the children and parents alike. Jesus said, 'let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs.'

Obituary - GEORGE APPS

18 Jan 1917 – 25 Feb 2016

Born in Lambeth, London, George's career was laid out for him; he followed his father and grandfather into the printing business, as a Print Compositor. Starting at the age of fourteen, he had a seven-year apprenticeship before being let loose on the 'Surrey Comet' newspaper.

George was a dispatch-rider during the war, and also served with the East Surreys in Dunkirk, North Africa, Italy and Palestine. Whilst his squad were re-grouping in Scotland, he met a young WRAF girl who was on leave. George and Elisabeth married after a short courtship before he went off to N. Africa and Elisabeth went back to Bletchley Park.

After the war, they set up house in Surrey and George worked for the Daily Mirror in Fleet Street, where he remained until his retirement. Their daughter Janet brought them great joy and mum and daughter gradually got dad involved in their church. He became the King of the Jumble Sale!!

George and Elisabeth loved sequence dancing, bowls and tennis and he was also a superb cook. When they moved to Cheltenham to be near to Janet and her family, they continued the dancing and bowls and they also became members of St. Andrew's in 1984, and endeared themselves to our hearts.

George had a stroke ten years ago which robbed him of much of his speech and hearing. He became dependent upon Elisabeth, who has been a rock. More than seventy years of marriage forged a partnership which has been humbling to those of us who have seen George and Elisabeth together. We pour out our love to Elisabeth and to Janet and give thanks to God for the witness and love of George. He was a wonderful man.

St Andrew's Charity for April: SUE RYDER

From small beginnings in 1953 as the Sue Ryder Foundation, then Sue Ryder Care, what is now simply Sue Ryder has grown to be a partner in international health and social care projects in Europe and Africa. It is a charity that is so well known that it hardly needs an introduction. Sadly, there are few among us who have not known or do not know someone who has “gone into the Sue Ryder.”

The Sue Ryder mission, in their own words, is to “provide compassionate care services to people with long term and end-of-life needs.” Palliative care is provided in hospices and care centres, and increasingly now in people’s own homes, embracing family, friends and carers as well. Cancer, multiple sclerosis, motor neurone disease, Parkinson’s disease and stroke are just some of the conditions covered by Sue Ryder.

There are over 9,000 volunteers engaged in this work and specialist medical and psychological help is provided where needed.

This month we ask you to remember those known to you who have been helped or are being helped by Sue Ryder, and make a communion offering for the work of a charity that does so much for sufferers and their families.

Since 2007 Sue Ryder has also been running its Prisoner Volunteer Programme, which has so far placed 400 prisoners in Sue Ryder shops, which are an important part of the fund raising programme, a programme that needs to raise over £13 million a year at today’s costs to keep the organisation going.


Maintenance Work at Prestbury St Mary's



Being an Eco Church

Five years ago St Andrew's took the decision to become an **Eco Church**. This means we're part of an ecumenical programme to help churches make the link between environmental issues and Christian Faith, and to respond with practical action. So here are some reminders of what we've done so far to play our part in caring for our world:

RECYCLING

We already **recycled** many items like batteries, paper and glasses but we've also expanded our recycling to include cable, greeting cards and teabags.

We have encouraged folk to reuse items by setting up a '**Freecycle**' service where things no longer wanted could be offered to others. Many things have found good, new homes in this way.



If you have any useful items you no longer need that might be of use to someone else please let Ann Lewis know with full details of the item and please leave your telephone number so we can get back to you.

Each Christmas, the Big Church Card enables us as a church to share festive greetings and raises money for Kenya UK.

We planted the herb garden by the north door using plants donated by the congregation.

WORKING WITH OTHER AGENCIES

In 2013, we invited the congregation to think about their carbon footprint by completing an online survey. This showed how the way we live, travel, and the food we eat has an impact on the world's resources and hopefully helped us to think about how we might live more sustainably.

We've also developed links with other environmental groups such as **Vision 21** and Gloucestershire's **Waste Minimization** team, and worked with **Cheltenham Green Doors** and **Gloucester Village Community Agents**.

SHARING INFORMATION

In 2013 we held our first **Green Fair** where we had a number of groups providing information on how to live more sustainably.

Last year (2015), we built on those links by inviting groups to have information stalls when the Bistro was open.

Last month, (February 2016) Alison Crane gave a very interesting talk to Wednesday Women on '**Global Footsteps Cookstoves for Kenya**' project.

Currently, we have been contacted about holding a **Repair Cafe** at St Andrew's which sounds an exciting opportunity to reduce waste and transfer skills.

CHURCH SERVICES

St Andrew's has held several Church Services with an environmental theme, most recently on Valentine's Day with our **Green Hearts** event, part of the '**Show the Love Campaign**' to raise awareness on Climate Change. Donations raised a grand total of £78 which we used to buy gifts from **Present Aid**:

- 1. Help to build a granary to help farmers keep their crops rot-free. Being able to store their harvest gives farmers the freedom to decide when to sell crops in order to get the best price.
- 2. Seed and training to help farmers create a floating garden for areas which are frequently flooded
- 3. Purchase a set of hand tools to help farmers in Mali where 75% of people make their living from farming. The change in climate is having a devastating effect on these small-scale farmers' lives.

We welcomed Steve Fisher on 10th February, from 'The Spring Centre', Olympus Park, Gloucester. Hardly anyone had heard of this amazing place and the wonderful group of people who help mentally and physically disabled young people. In 1982 three ladies with disabled children started the group. By 1985 the group had moved to GRH, till 2000 when they moved to their present location in Quedgeley. 'The Spring Centre' is a Charity registered with Ofsted.

A hundred people attend every week, aged from birth to eighteen, some autistic; many have Downs Syndrome, some deaf and blind. We saw pictures of a soft play area and a ball pit, a sensory room, football pitch, even a wheelchair swing and roundabout. We saw excited youngsters at the Zoo and at an educational farm. The days out help to build up their self-esteem and their life-skills through teaching and play. Steve explained that he and his wife got involved as their daughter, now aged 26, desperately needed help. She was born with cerebral palsy, epilepsy plus behavioural issues. An after school club takes place where children from local schools help out. Everyone has a freshly cooked meal and then they help with organised events. This was an interesting and informative afternoon.

We welcome new members, any Wednesday at 2.15pm, for fun, friendship entertainment and refreshments.

Cheltenham Foodbank

The foodbank has been open four years now and in that time has provided food for over 7,000 folk in need. We have given out over 68,000 Kg food, all of which has been donated. So thank you all.
