Prestbury United Reformed Church is in the heart of Prestbury village on the northern edge of Cheltenham. A former Congregational chapel built in 1866, becoming United Reformed on unification in 1972.



The Church in Warden Hill is a Local Ecumenical Partnership (LEP) between the Anglican (St Christopher's) and URC communities of Up Hatherley and Warden Hill in the south of Cheltenham. Ministry is shared between the URC Minister, Rev Maz Allen, and Rev Gary Grady of the Anglican South Cheltenham Team Ministry. Both the Anglican and URC buildings are regularly used for worship. Our Minister Writes:



Dear Friends,

I have just watched the Commonwealth celebration service in Westminster Abbey: Fifty three countries with their flags, their religions and their traditional dress. It is truly heart-warming to see so many countries coming together and championing peace. Independence does not necessarily mean going it alone. Coming together to work for global change is a precious thing.

As we celebrate Easter, we pause to reflect that Jesus came also to work for global change. He was never critical of the Jewish Law; he was critical of man-made laws that crowded out simple devotion, making a relationship with God complicated and difficult. Jesus came to break down barriers between the people and God. He died to get his point across, and his resurrection brought hope and promise and purpose – he brought global change.

Today, we may feel that individually we have little hope of changing our world. However, change begins where we are. Even a small gesture of love, compassion, forgiveness, trust, can open the eyes of the recipient that they may say ‘that person is a Christian.’ We don’t need any better ‘thank you’ than that.

Our faith in Jesus is not restricted to the Commonwealth. We are a world-wide family of believers and in unity with our brothers and sisters around the world, we shout:

**Jesus is risen!
He is risen indeed!
Alleluia!**

Mike Wilson – an appreciation

We were all very sad to hear the news of the passing of Mike and our thoughts and prayers remain with Jean and the family.

Members and friends of St Andrew's may not be aware of the very particular debt we owe to Mike when we consider the building today. In the early 1990s when Mike was a serving Elder, he had the vision to challenge the Church about the building and its future. Mike saw that the rigid layout of the Sanctuary with the fixed pews and the organ dominated the front view together with the poor state of the rooms around the hall and the inconvenient floor plan, could not serve the mission of the church.

"Look to the Future" was his slogan and in response, the Elders undertook preliminary work. The Church then started the redevelopment process with a fund raising committee. We were blessed by the power of the Spirit so that the congregation gave generously and we were able to undertake the work on the Sanctuary (not without a struggle to get permission to remove the pews), to create the Link Gallery and the suite of meeting rooms we have today, including decent loos!

I hear very many positive comments from community users of our buildings so Mike's vision has been realised in that respect while the design of the sanctuary has opened up all kinds of possibilities for extending worship and permitting other activities.

When you come into St Andrew's, look around and remember Mike.

St. Andrew's Charity for April 2017

THE WINDERMERE CENTRE

The URC's Centre for Learning in Windermere is housed in what was the manse of the old Carver URC, which is only a few yards away. The church itself is now the conference venue, having been completely refurbished and equipped with chairs and all the aids necessary for an up-to-date Conference Centre. The house has 21 ensuite bedrooms, with facilities for disabled visitors. The restaurant can cater for up to 50 guests and full board is available. The Centre's chapel is also located within the house. Outside there are gardens to explore and of course the whole of the Lake District is on the doorstep. And all this is available for a quiet holiday or a retreat to relax and recharge.



The Windermere Centre is primarily a Training Centre for the URC, with residential courses available on a great variety of subjects ranging from Bible study to arts and crafts. It is a place for peaceful reflection, renewal and development of faith and spirituality, enriched by the beautiful surroundings and the chance to take a break from the everyday.

Fees are modest and there is always the Hannah Fund to help in case of need. The Fund exists to ensure that no-one is prevented from attending courses at the Centre for financial reasons. It was set up by Raymond and Ruth Clarke in memory of their daughter, Hannah, who died tragically as a result of a cycling accident while visiting them in the Lake District. The Hannah Fund also paid for the ground floor wing that hosts state-of-the-art accommodation for disabled guests.

The Windermere Centre is not entirely self-funding and needs help from donations to be able to continue the work for both the URC and the wider church. 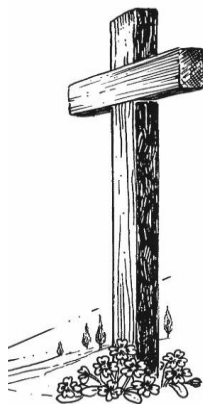

Walking to Everest Base Camp for Winstons's Wish

I am leaving for Nepal in a couple of weeks to go and trek to Everest Base Camp. This is something I have wanted to do for some time and having decided to actually go and do it I decided that I would raise money for charity. I have chosen Winston's Wish as they are a really important one, and they are based locally. I have raised money for them in the past because their work is so important.



Winston's Wish were the UK's first childhood bereavement charity set up in 1992. They were set up to meet the needs of bereaved children and their families. Few of us can imagine what it is like for a child to lose a mum or dad, or even worse both, nor can we imagine what a child needs when the bottom drops out of their world. Winston's Wish have developed a range of practical support and guidance on bereavement to children, their families and professionals. They also offer specialist support programmes for children affected by deaths related to murder, manslaughter, suicide or the military community.

More than 100 children are bereaved of a parent every day.

41,000 children are bereaved every single year in the UK.

1 in 25 children and young people have experienced bereavement of a parent.

Winston's Wish have reached 40,000 children every year through their Helpline.

1,501 children were supported in 2015/16.
